

### MARBLE'S EASTER OFFERING 2024 A PART OF OUR HERITAGE OF GIVING

He is risen! We have made it through the season of Lent to the triumph of Jesus' Resurrection. Marble has a long tradition, since Easter 1968, of giving to those in need through our Easter Offering. The goal now, as it was then, is to give grants to deserving non-profit organizations that support others in need. The grants focus on these areas:

- Shelter
  Hunger
- HungerHealth (including mental health)
- Health (including)
  Education
- Social Justice and Empowerment

How great is the need?

- Every night in New York City (2023): 92,879 homeless people slept in NYC's main municipal shelter system. This number includes 21,774 families and 33,399 homeless children.
- In 2023, 2 in 5 New York City families, or 800K households, experienced food insecurity. That is 12% higher than the national average, and 21% higher than the rest of New York State. The use of New York City pantries has increased 60% since 2019.
- Food insecurity raises the incidence of depression by more than 50%, or almost twice the incidence of food-sufficient New Yorkers.
- More than 31% of New Yorkers reported poor mental health in 2023. 40% of younger adults between 18-34 reported poor mental health.
- 8.3% of New York City high school students reported having attempted suicide. That rate rises to 32% when those students have been bullied in the 12 months prior and identified as lesbian, gay, or bisexual or were not sure of their gender identity. 1 in 3 transgender youth in New York City have seriously thought about taking their lives, with 2 in 5 of those reporting a suicide attempt in the past 12 months.
- Of New York City's population of 8.65 million, 20% are over 60 years old. A greater
  percentage of income is spent on medical expenses and housing as people age,
  leaving less for food and incidental expenses.
- Hate crimes are rising. Hate crimes increased by 90% between 2020 and 2022; NYPD statistics show a sharp spike since October 7, 2023. While murder, shooting, rape, robbery, and grand larceny went down (4.1%) in late 2023, targeted groups (Black, Jewish, immigrant, Muslim, and LGBT residents) showed an increase in hate crime incidents of 33%.

In past years, Marble's Easter Offering has supported non-profit organizations that address these needs. This includes organizations like the following:

- Holy Apostles Soup Kitchen, Food Bank for New York City, and Grow NYC which address food insecurity.
- Daniel's Music, Blanton Peale, Visions for the Blind, and NAMI which focus on healthcare.
- Housing Plus, Urban Pathways, Setshabelo and Search and Care that have had positive impacts on homelessness and housing.
- CASA NYC, Kaleidoscope, Search and Care for the elderly, and Partnership to End Human Trafficking (PEHT) which focus on social justice and empowerment.
- New York Sun Works and Lutheran Ministries in Higher Education which not only focus on education but also on hunger and LGBTQIA+ issues.

Together with Marble, organizations like those above strive to make a positive difference in the lives of the most vulnerable among us. 100% of Marble's Easter Offering goes to grants awarded to well-vetted non-profit organizations.
